BOARD:

Village residents Ron and Barb Langdon, 7 Lorraine Drive, addressed the board with concern over a recent delinquent water bill. The Langdons stated that they have never missed a payment and they never received the bill and feel that they should not have had to pay the late fee. They addressed this issue with the post office and had a letter of support from the Postmaster. They also expressed that they did not like the response given at the time and felt like they were put into the category of other people that state they didn't get a bill so that they don't have to pay the water bill. Mayor Mink stated that although he doesn't question their sincerity or honesty, the problem becomes how do you credit some and not others. Trustee Trimm gave an example of when she had to pay a late fee. Barb stated that she understands the boards position but residents should be told a different statement rather than grouping people into categories as a way to explain.

The Board reviewed a quote from Mark Porretta Excavating for the replacement of two fire hydrants. There will need to be an updated quote as there is a third hydrant that needs to be replaced. Mayor Mink informed the board that Randy would be having surgery on May 30. Mayor Mink also stated that Amy and Sandy are not to have anyone call Randy, Fred or Roger would call if need be. Mayor Mink also informed the board that he prefers that they go through him rather than directly to the DPW laborers if they have work they would like them to do.

Trustee Lonneville will give the guys some training on forming up concrete. He will work with them on the small concrete pads where the picnic tables are. Mayor Mink made a motion, seconded by Trustee Lonneville and carried, to accept the newest member, Gerald Della Porta, into the Shortsville Fire Department. The board discussed the most recent park map from Ontario County. The map includes the area beyond the island that is not actually designated park land. The board agreed to leave the map as is.

There was no further business to come before the board, so the meeting was adjourned by motion of Trustee Lonneville seconded by Mayor Mink, and carried unanimously at 3:58 P.M.
